The concept of "Greater Plattsburgh" is critical, and together this combination of Town and City becomes the uptown and downtown portions of our community: a destination in which to live, work and play.










BOUNDARIES OF THE DOWNTOWN NEIGHBORHOOD

- Plattsburgh residents defined downtown as the onesixth square mile including Waterfront access to Lake Champlain and Saranac River
- Nationally registered historic district

SIZE OF DOWNTOWN PLATTSBURGH

- Thousands are drawn to an increasing amount of events held during the year
- Downtown is in walking distance for over 7000 residents
- Nearby SUNY campus is host to nearly 6,000 both local and international per year
- Number of employed has grown from 39,418 to 41,796
- Labor income increased 0.9% to \$1.866 billion
- Annual growth rate of economic output 3.76%, above the U.S. average

PAST INVESTMENTS & FUTURE INVESTMENT POTENTIAL

- Grant-funded North Country Co-Op renovations, supporting local agri-tourism
- Development and renovation of Saranac River Trail; Saranac Street Bridge conversion to STEAM Learning Lab through grant funds
- Development of Arts Corridor through the revitalization of Strand Center for the Arts via multiple grants and community donations
- Funded study into Durkee Street as potential space for City Center lot can accommodate a 5 story structure, including retail space and mixed income housing
- Development and collaboration in "smart" infrastructure to allow free public Wi-Fi

OUR JOB GROWTH

- Approx. 9,500 workers are employed within City boundaries
- Unemployment nearly cut in half for the Plattsburgh Micropolitan Statistical Area continuing a 5 year trend of decreasing; this year to 5.4%
- 341 bed community hospital employing over 2,500 is within short distance of City Center
- Regional studies show growth in manufacturing sector; largest cluster of manufacturers located in Clinton County

ATTRACTIVENESS OF THE DOWNTOWN

- Mixed use spaces; mixed income housing
- Downtown storefronts, facades and residences restored and updated
- Saranac River Trail to connect with downtown by end of 2016
- City Center connected to Arts corridor and Margaret Street restaurants
- Increased availability of local, healthy foods in City Center; open year-round to all income levels
- Waterfront land ready for development
- 3 parks in immediate area of project; 18 parks located throughout city
- Newly redesigned bike paths connecting new Plattsburgh to its historic roots

ENHANCING THE QUALITY OF LIFE

- Expanded outdoor retail and dining
- ADA accessible sidewalks
- Food and arts gathering in Trinity
 Park approved to run in summer
- Extensive upgrades to wastewater treatment plant; focusing on odors, noise and aesthetics
- Public transport improvements with a fleet of 16 local buses
- Accessible, affordable air travel through Plattsburgh International Aimort
- Active partnership with Lake Champlain Basin Program working on water quality, human health and aquatic ecosystems
- Collaboration with the Town of Plattsburgh
